Spiti Valley Itinerary

Day 1: Departure to Delhi

Hello Travelers, it's time to get Spitified! We assemble at our respective boarding stations in Mumbai, Pune, Surat, or Vadodara and board the train to Delhi. The journey promises to be fun-filled with games and interactive sessions. Trains may include Paschim Express or Rajdhani, boarding from either Mumbai Central (MMCT) or Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT), depending on your location and time of booking. Note: Train tickets will be either confirmed or RAC (half window seat), based on availability. Meals are not included during this journey.

**Day 2: Delhi to Shimla (Overnight Volvo Journey)**

Upon arrival in Delhi, we gather at the designated pickup point—tentatively Kashmere Gate—between 10:00 PM and 11:00 PM. Here, you'll meet the trip captains and get a brief orientation about the journey ahead. Soon after, we board our overnight Volvo and begin our road journey to Shimla. (Exact bus timings will be shared a day before departure.)

Day 3: Arrival in Shimla | Drive to Chitkul / Sangla

After a short pitstop for breakfast at Narkanda, we resume our scenic drive through the breathtaking Kinnaur Valley, following the Satluj River. Our destination is Chitkul—the last inhabited village near the Indo-China border—or alternatively, Sangla. By evening, we check in to our hotel, have dinner, and rest for the night.

Day 4: Chitkul/Sangla to Nako

We begin the day with a serene sunrise and a stroll through the charming village of Chitkul. Post exploration, we drive towards Nako, halting at Khab where the Sutlej and Spiti rivers converge. By evening, we reach the tranquil village of Nako, check into our hotel, and enjoy dinner followed by an overnight stay.

Day 5: Nako to Kaza

After breakfast, we set off toward Kaza, the heart of Spiti Valley. En route, we pass through the Sumdo border and visit the ancient Tabo Monastery. There's also an option to explore the Gue Monastery (home to a 500-year-old mummy) and the cliff-perched Dhankar Monastery. We reach Kaza before nightfall, where we unwind, have dinner, and stay overnight.

Day 6: Exploring Spiti - Komic, Hikkim, Langza, Key & Chicham

Today is dedicated to exploring the gems of Spiti. After breakfast, we visit the magnificent Key Monastery and Chicham Bridge, the highest bridge in Asia. From there, we head to Hikkim to see the world's highest post office, then proceed to Komic, one of the highest motorable villages. Our journey continues to Langza, known for its ancient fossils and iconic Buddha statue. After a full day of adventure, we return to Kaza for dinner and an overnight stay.

Day 7: Kaza to Chandratal

Following an early breakfast, we check out and begin our journey to the mystical Chandratal Lake. We stop at Losar, the last inhabited village of Spiti, for a short break and



snacks. By afternoon, we reach Batal and head to our campsite near Chandratal. After settling in, we enjoy dinner and a magical night under a sky full of stars and the Milky Way.

Day 8: Chandratal to Manali

Wake up to a crisp mountain morning, have breakfast, and start our journey toward Manali. We traverse the rugged roads of Lahaul and Spiti to reach Manali by evening. After checking into the hotel, we set out for a casual café crawl through the vibrant lanes of Old Manali. Dinner and an overnight stay at the hotel follow.

Day 9: Manali Exploration & Departure to Delhi

After a leisurely morning and breakfast, the day is free for self-exploration. You can visit the Hadimba Devi Temple, take a walk down Old Manali Street, and shop at Mall Road. By evening, we begin our overnight Volvo journey back to Delhi.

Day 10: Arrive in Delhi | Return Journey

We reach Delhi in the early hours, marking the end of our Winter Spiti Road Trip. From here, you can board your pre-booked train or flight back to your hometown.

Day 11: Back to Mumbai-Pune-Surat-Vadodara

After an incredible adventure, it's time to bid goodbye to new friends and take home beautiful memories. You'll reach your respective cities—Mumbai, Pune, Surat, or Vadodara—bringing the trip to a close.

Quick-dry tees are essential for maintaining hygiene during travel. Lightweight and breathable, they can be washed and dried easily between stops.

7. Cotton Socks (3 Pairs):

Comfortable and breathable, cotton socks are ideal for daily wear. Be sure to change them frequently and avoid wearing damp ones to prevent blisters and discomfort.

8. Woolen Socks (1 Pair):

Warm and odor-resistant, woolen socks (especially merino wool) are great for cold nights. They provide superior insulation and comfort while sleeping or lounging.

9. Poncho/Rain Cover:

We will drive from Chandigarh towards Shimla district covering Kinnaur and finally reach Himachal Pradesh Spiti Valley. Beautiful tour through the high mountains and deep valleys of Kinnaur. Our journey from Spiti Valley to Manali will be incredibly unforgiving roads, and with the weather, we will cross the high pass of Kunzum la. This trip is only possible from June when the road between Kunzum and Atal Tunnel was built beneath the Rohtang Pass in the eastern Pir Panjal Range of the Himalayas. On the Leh-Manali Highway in Himachal Pradesh, India. Lahaul Spiti Valley nearest airports is Chandigarh and Bhuntar Kullu.

Things to see on Spiti Valley Tour - Spiti valley itinerary

It is bordered by Ladakh, Lahaul, Kullu and Kinnaur. Spiti Valley at the height of 2,745 metres above sea level. The Kumzum La or Kumzum Pass, located at an altitude of 14,930 feet above sea level, is the gateway into Spiti Valley from Lahaul.

Important Notes

1. Weather Conditions and Accessibility:

- High-altitude areas such as Hikkim, Komik, Langza, and Pin Valley may become inaccessible during winter months due to extreme snowfall. The visit to these places is dependent on weather conditions, and alternative locations will be provided if necessary.

2. Acts of God (Heavy Snowfall, Road Closures):

- In case of road closures or other unforeseen weather-related issues (acts of God), travelers may need to arrange their own 4x4 vehicles. Any associated costs for this arrangement will be the responsibility of the travelers.

3. Arrival and Departure Timings:

- Travelers arriving from outside Delhi should ensure they book their trains or flights to reach Delhi by 4 PM on the trip start date.
- On the return journey, it is advised to book a flight/train departing after 2 PM to ensure smooth travel.

4. Itinerary Changes:

- Due to various factors such as weather, road conditions, or the physical capacity of participants, the itinerary may be adjusted. The organizers reserve the right to change schedules to ensure the safety, comfort, and well-being of all travelers.



5. Age Limit for Group Departures:

- Group departures are available for travelers aged between 16 and 42 years due to the physically demanding nature of the itinerary. However, custom trips can be arranged for those outside this age range.

Question 1: What is the distance between Manali and Spiti Valley India?

Answer: Manali and Spiti Valley location are 196 kilometers apart. You can cover this distance in 10 hours. The shortest route that crosses NH505 is around 177.1 km.

Question 2: What is the distance between Delhi and Spiti Valley?

Answer: Delhi and Spiti Valley are 747 kilometers apart.

Question 3: What is the Temperature in Spiti Valley?

Answer: From January to March, the temperature in Spiti valley remains between -4 to -35 degrees centigrade. Depending upon your height, it varies from -4 to 17 degrees centigrade from April to October.

Question 4: How is the weather like in Spiti Valley?

Answer: The winters are frigid. The heavy snowfall makes the weather harsh. The entry points like Kunzum Pass and Rohtang Pass remain closed from the end of October till June sometimes. You may still enter the valley through other routes if you can bear the chill. The best weather conditions are between the end of June and October.

Question 5: What is the best time to visit Spiti Valley?

Answer: Best time to visit Spiti Valley is June to October every year. During these months, you can complete the entire circuit tour from Chandigarh to Kaza to Manali.

Question 6: What is the height of Spiti Valley?



Answer: The valley of Spiti is encircled by steep mountain ranges. The high Kunzum Pass, at 15,059 feet, separates Spiti and Lahaul valleys 4,590 meters.

Question 7: What are the conditions of the roads that lead to Spiti Valley?

Answer: The Road conditions are average; you do have some patches where you need to drive carefully. Due to high altitude, travelers will get affected during their travel.

Question 8: Where is Spiti Valley?

Answer: Spiti Valley is located in Himachal Pradesh, and it's known as the cold desert of the north.

Question 9: How to reach Spiti Valley?

Answer: You can reach Spiti through various ways of transport.

By Road: Spiti doesn't have its airport or railways hence you have to travel to it by road.

By Train: The nearest railway station to Spiti is Shimla, Chandigarh, Ambala, or Delhi.

By Air: Bhuntar Kullu's nearest airport, but you can also plan air travel to Chandigarh and then a road trip to Spiti.

Question 10: When does it snow in Spiti?

Answer: October to March of the year are the months when it snows in Spiti. The temperature hovers between 8 degrees centigrade to minus 10 degrees celsius.

Question 11: Best time to visit Spiti Valley?

Answer: Spiti Valley can be visited via the Kinnaur route throughout the year. June to October will be the best time to complete the circuit from Chandigarh to Shimla to Kinnaur to Spiti Valley to Manali.

Tabo Spiti was named after the monastery it houses, which is the home of meditation in the Tabo Monastery and is said to have been founded around 996 CE. Tabo is an ancient town that became a revered Buddhist center, with several monasteries being established here as per dates inscribed on them. Some are cave types, and some are built of bricks or wood.

It has few homestays during the winter months, famous for the White Spiti expedition. Tabo has one of India's highest altitude SBI branches. Travelers prefer staying at Tabo Spiti during their travels from Tabo to Kaza.

Answer: Nako village is established at 3,625 meters or 11,893 feet; Nako is the biggest settlement in the Hangrang Valley with the backdrop of Reo Purgyal, Himachal Pradesh's tallest peak at 6,816 meters or 22,362 feet. Nako to Kaza distance is 112 kilometers.

Spiti is an excellent region in India that is a must-visit for anyone who loves to trek, be a part of nature, and relax. It's hilly, rocky and lush. The best time to visit Spiti is from May to October. Spiti Valley Temperature will be extreme during the winter months.

Spiti Valley Temperature drops to -25°C on average. The best time to explore the snowy slopes of the Himalayas. Whatever be your endeavour, from trekking to snowboarding and skiing, you cannot afford to miss this frosty season. It's best to travel in the summer season from May to September, and there are chances of Landslides and rains during these months.

Spiti Valley Temperature Chart

December to March, it snows in Spiti valley temperature will range from -7 to -30 degrees Celcius. Be ready to use dry toilets as most water freezes up, there are frequent power cuts, and most hotels are closed during the winter or not equipped for a winter stay.

Tourists will have to stay at a homestay built to withstand such extreme winters. Homestays are very comfortable and warm, and your host will be amiable. Ensure to carry snow chains for your vehicle as there are chances of black ice and slippery roads due to snowfall.



April to May, the Spiti valley weather ranges from zero to -12; roads to Manali are not open for transport. This is an excellent time to travel as road conditions are better than in the Spiti valley winter months.

June to November is the peak season for Spiti Valley as the road to Manali open up with tourist coming quickly from Manali to Kaza. The Spiti Valley Temperature is pleasant during this period. All hotels are open for business, and you can complete the entire circuit from Delhi to Chandigarh to Kinnaur to Spiti Valley to Manali during this season.

How is the weather in Spiti Valley?

Lahaul Spiti is a picturesque valley in the Himalayas. Lahaul Spiti valley is the hidden gem of Himachal Pradesh and is surrounded by snow-capped peaks and forests of oak, pine, and birch. This place is home to ancient monasteries, scenic hikes, remote villages and hospitable locals who welcome visitors with open arms.

Spiti Valley in Summer from April to June

The climate in Spiti valley is pleasant between April and June, and the coldest weather during this time can go as low as -4 degrees Celsius. India's last pristine tourist spot.

Spiti valley is an outdoor adventurer's haven. Sunny days, clean air, and nature's sounds will make you feel at peace. There are many things to do here- trekking, camping, mountain biking, and even hiking in the Himalayas. And if that weren't enough, you can also sip on some authentic Chhang made from locally grown barley.

Spiti Valley in Winter from October to March

Spiti Valley has a harsh and cold climate, with temperatures dropping to minus 25 degrees Celsius. The best time to visit the Valley is between October and March if you plan to see the snow leopards. Spiti Valley mountains are covered in snow and the months that we call the winter season.

Spiti Valley in Rains from July to September

To plan a trip to the Himalayan region, knowing the weather conditions is essential. Weather in Spiti valley ranges from 13°C to 27°C during the rainy season. Most of the



roads also remain unwelcoming owing to natural calamities and landslides. This is why it's essential to take precautions before planning a trip to this region. The condition of the road to Spiti valley has improved a lot over the years.

Manali to Spiti valley distance?

The road distance between Manali to Spiti Valley is 196 kilometres. It takes five hours to cover this distance. Which is the nearest airport to Spiti valley?

Depending on the time of the year, the nearest airport to Spiti Valley changes. During the winter months, Chandigarh is the nearest airport to Spiti Valley, and during the summer months, Bhuntar airport near Kullu is the closest to Lahaul Spiti Valley, India. Spiti valley from Chandigarh is open throughout the year.

Kaza Spiti Valley to Bhuntar airport distance is 230 kilometres; it will take six hours to cover this distance. Spiti Valley Kaza to Chandigarh airport distance is 490 kilometres. It will take 12 hours to cover this distance as per navigation maps, and ideally, you will need two days to cover this distance.
