By Air: If you wish to come by flight, the nearest airport is Jaipur, 160 km & you can take an early morning flight on 26th May.

Day One - Arrival at Ranthambore and afternoon jungle safari

Ranthambore Tiger Safari Itinerary

The affordable itinerary for a visit to the Ranthambore national park comes with a package of two nights and three days. On the first day, you and other guests would be picked up from Sawai Madhopur at 10:00 a.m. They will take you to the Ranthambore National Park in a private vehicle. Time would be accommodated for the check-in, rest, and lunch, after which you, along with other guests, will leave for the first Wildlife Safari. In the evening, you will be back from the first trip. The day ends with a first-class dinner.

On the second day, you will leave for the second wildlife safari after breakfast. You will return to the resort for lunch, after which the third wildlife safari begins. On the return, dinner would be served and lights off.

On the third day, everyone would have to leave for the Ranthambore fort visit early in the morning. After the last trip, your luggage would be checked out and kept safely in the vehicles. After lunch and post-lunch, a private car would drop you at Sawai Madhopur.



Biodiversity of Ranthambore

The biodiversity and nature of the Ranthambore National Park that it has gathered with care make the park unique. Making the place a secure animal habitat and a protected breeding ground. The NGOs and government forest department work day and night to maintain the fresh and clean ecosystem of the park. The park is divided into two different types of plantations.

One is a dry deciduous forest, and the other is a grassy meadow. According to reports and analysis, 539 flower species are in the region. The trees that are most commonly seen in the area are Dhok trees. Other species of plants that grow in this park are Sal, Mahua, Imli, Banyan, Khair, Jamun, and Palas.

Ranthambore Wildlife

Since 1973, tiger safaris have made the Ranthambore national park well known around the world because of its large and increasing population of tigers. The [biggest tigers hub](#) in Asia is a result of Project Tiger, which was started by the government of India in 1973. Till 2008, there were only 48 tigers, including adults and cubs, as per the 2014 consensus. But, with the support of the government and NGOs, the tiger count in the region has reached 62 tigers.

Ranthambore National Park is home to a wide range of animals, birds, and reptiles. Along with the tiger, other mammals that are commonly found here include jungle cats, caracals, chinkaras, jackals, long-eared hedgehogs, blackbucks, sloth bears, and chitals. Moreover, some unique animals or rare types of animals that you will find roaming in this space are Hanuman langurs, Indian false vampires, Indian flying foxes, Indian gerbils, small Indian mongooses, and Indian mole rats.

Ranthambore, being a vast terrain, contains many small and large water bodies. As a result, it has an even population of birds, of which some are residents and others are migrants. According to a document, more than 270 different types of birds live in the park. The people have discovered some fantastic high-altitude spots. These spots are best known for seeing these birds around the region.

These include the Ranthambore Fort, Malik Talao, Padam Talao, and Rajbagh Talao. Some birds commonly seen in the region are the Graylag Goose, Indian Grey Hornbills, Woodpeckers, Cuckoos, Common Kingfishers, Bee Eaters, Asian Palm Swift, Parakeets,



Nightjars, Owls, Crakes, Doves, and Pigeons. Snipes, Terns, Sandpipers, Gulls, Eagles, Great Crested Grebe, Darters, Herons, Pelicans, Cormorants, Egrets, Bitterns, Ibis, Sparrows, Minivets, Flamingos, Storks, Treepies, Pittas, Shrikes, Crows, Mynas, Orioles, Cuckoo-Shrikes, Flycatchers, Wagtails, Ioras, Bayas, Bulbul, Falcons, and

Safari Gates and Booking

Open Jungle Safari Park is a major attraction for the public and the most popular option to detect animal movement. There are 10 zones where you can enter the national park. The Department of Forests (Government of India) controls and manages the safari bookings at Ranthambore National Park. You can also book a safari online by filling out a permit form. You need to fill in all the boxes with the required details. A valid identity card would be required to check the validity and as proof of the details provided.

Ranthambore Safari Timings

- Tiger Safari is open from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. in the morning.
- Tiger Safari evening timings are from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm.
- Park hours change throughout the year depending on the season.

Rules and Regulations of Gir National Park

Travellers cannot get out of the vehicle during the whole safari tour. Moreover, a set of rules and regulations are to be followed by every tourist. As the tourist guide is aware of all the practises, you need to follow the guide's instructions. There are different gates to enter the national park, each with a unique name. You can only explore the region allocated to the safari gate you come through. Exploring multiple zones in one safari is not allowed as per the regulations of the park. The cars would enter and exit the park from the same gate. Gipsy jeep charges are to be paid on the spot, along with safari gate charges, camera fees, and guide fees.

Ranthambore Weather

The climate of Ranthambore is extreme, with hot summers and colder winters. A tropical monsoon climate is experienced, with heavy rainfall in the region. From March to June, the temperature is around 30 to 45 degrees. In the winter, the temperature ranges from 4



to 25 degrees. The monsoon season occurs from June to September, and the recorded rainfall is 1000 mm. During the rainy season, the national park was closed.

Hotels & Resorts

Ranthambore's hotels and resorts also promote traditional Rajasthani culture by offering traditional dishes, putting on folk music and dance shows, and giving tours of nearby villages. On one side of Ranthambore, there are hotels that are good for families, and on the other, there are many romantic places to stay. Some of these hotels have been renovated from historic structures, such as palaces, into accessible accommodations for people with disabilities. There are many places to stay in Ranthambore that offer once-in-a-lifetime experiences.

Charges For The Ranthambore Safari

Ranthambore Safari prices change depending on the type of vehicle and the passengers' nationalities. The price per person for a Jeep (6-seater) is INR 1800 for Indian citizens and INR 3700 for non-Indians. Similarly, a Canter (20-seater) costs INR 1300 per passenger for Indian citizens and INR 2700 per passenger for non-Indian citizens.

Ranthambore Jungle Safari Timings

If you plan to visit the park and go on a jungle safari, you need to be aware of the timing. The following is a rundown of the schedule for the Ranthambore Jungle Safari, organised by the month:



October: From 1–31 October, the morning safari runs from 6:30–10 AM. 2:30–6:00 is the evening safari.

November to January: The morning safari starts at 7:00 AM and ends at 10:30 AM from November to January. 2:00–5:30 is the evening safari.

February to March: From February 1 to March 31, the morning safari runs from 6:30 to 10:00 AM. 2:30–6:00 is the evening safari.

April to mid-May: The morning safari begins at 6:00 AM and ends around 9:30 AM. 3:00 to 6:30 is the evening safari.

Mid-May to June: The morning safari runs from 6:00 to 9:30 AM from 15 May to 30 June. 3:30–7:00 is the evening safari.

It is crucial to remember that the times are subject to change due to weather and other factors. It is advisable to check with the authorities to have up-to-date information as the timings are subject to change due to various factors.

When is the best season to visit Ranthambore National Park?

Ranthambore National Park, one of India's most visited tourist spots, is open from October to June. The winter season, from October to March, is the most popular period for visiting Ranthambore National Park because of the mild temperatures (between 10 and 30 degrees Celsius).

Which month is best for seeing tigers in Ranthambore?

The best times to see tigers in Ranthambore are in the summer (May–June) and winter (October–March). Tigers spend the winter months lying in the sun, whereas in the summer they are more likely to be found around watering holes.

Which gate is best in Ranthambore National Park?



The Singh Dwar serves as the entry and departure point for this zone, which is popular with tourists because of the greater probability of seeing a tiger in this area. The best spots to see big cats in this region are Sultanpur, Tuti ka Nalla, Amreshwar Dang, Gada Dub, and Peela Pani.

When does the gate to the Ranthambore Tiger Reserve open and close?

Starting on October 1, visitors can enjoy Ranthambore National Park & Tiger Reserve till June 30. Although though Ranthambore National Park is restricted from July to September, visitors can still access the reserve through Gates 6 through 10. Kundal, Chidikho, Balas, Kuwalji, and Aantri are the five areas that serve as buffers.

Ranthambore closes during which months?

The park is closed from July - September during the monsoon season, which also happens to be mating season for animals. From April to June, the greatest time to visit Ranthambore for wildlife viewing is right before the rains.

Who was Machali, and what made her one of the most famous tigers in Ranthambore National Park?

Machali—The Tiger Queen of Ranthambore

Commonly known as T-16, was a well known Bengal tiger who lived in Ranthambore National Park. It was said that Machali was among the largest tigers that lived in the area. She was famous for her exceptional swimming and hunting abilities and was born in Sawai Madhopur in the early '90s. She made a huge contribution to the park's tourism business because of how many people came to the park because of her fame to see her perform. Machali died in 2016 at the age of 20, leaving a legacy as one of the most famous tigers in Ranthambore National Park.



How to reach Ranthambore National Park by Air, Train, and Road

Ranthambore National Park in Rajasthan, India, is accessible by air, train, or road. Here's the details:

Air: Jaipur International Airport is 180 kilometres from Ranthambore National Park. From the airport, take a taxi or private cab to the park.

Train: Sawai Madhopur Railway Station is the closest train station to Ranthambore National Park and connects to Delhi, Mumbai, and Jaipur. From the station, take a taxi or private cab to the park.

Road: Udaipur, Jaipur and Jodhpur are close to Ranthambore National Park by road. These cities have taxis and buses to the park. Private cabs can be booked online for a stress-free trip.

Due to its distant location and often poor road conditions, travelers to Ranthambore National Park are advised to plan accordingly.

When Does Ranthambore National Park Open/Close?

Usually, the park opens and closes with sunrise and sunset. The park opens 30 minutes after sunrise and closes 30 minutes before sunset. Seasonal fluctuations in dawn and sunset time affect Ranthambore National Park entry and leave times.

The morning safari begins 30 minutes after sunrise and ends 30 minutes before sunset. So, the time changes along with the seasons.

Bird sighting in Ranthambore National Park

Between November and March, you can see a wide variety of migratory birds, including painted storks, spoonbills, flamingos, sarus cranes, and greylag geese. If you're serious about bird watching, you should get to the lake before dawn during this time of year.



Can you stay inside of Ranthambore?

Depending on their budget, preferences, and needs, visitors can select from a variety of lodging options, including a fully equipped tent, a resort, or a hotel. It is important to highlight that there is no possibility of any wild animals entering the tourist properties because they are all located outside of the wildlife reserve.

Is it common to see tigers in Ranthambore?

The Ranthambore wildlife sanctuary is one of the best sites in India to observe wild animals in their natural habitat. It is most famous for the tiger sightings that take place there. Tigers are easy to find even in the daytime.

Which zone of Ranthambore is the best place for seeing tigers?

The most well-known tigers in the Ranthambore reserve forest live in Zone 01, which includes the territories of Sultan (T-72), Noor (T-39), and Ustad (T-24). This area, where travellers have a better possibility of seeing a tiger, can be entered and exited through the Singh Dwar.

Which zone of Ranthambore has the most tigers?

The most preferred and favourite safari zone among tourists is Zone 3. There are certain things that divide Zone 3 from the other zones. As a result, this zone contains three lakes: Padam Lake, Rajbagh Lake, and Malik Lake. This area of Ranthambore is said to be the best possible setting for tigers.

How big is Ranthambore National Park?

1334 sq. km. The forests is named after Ranthambore Fort, which has a 1000-year heritage. Chauhan rulers built it in 944 AD on a 700-foot hill in the park.



The combined size of Ranthambore National Park's two sanctuaries, Mansingh and Kaila Devi, is 392 sq.km. Ten zones plus a buffer make up the park. Ranthambore National Park ranks as one of the largest and most visited parks in all of northern India.

Gypsy or canter—which is better?

Canter safaris and jeep safaris are both popular ways to see Ranthambore National Park. Which one you choose will probably depend on your personal tastes and the kind of experience you want. Most people think of Jeep safaris as rougher and more exciting. They are best for people who want to see the more remote parts of the park and get a feel for the natural terrain. Most Jeep safaris only have a few seats, so you will have a more private and intimate experience. On the other hand, canter safaris use larger, more comfortable vehicles which can fit up to 20 people. They are usually used for group tours and are better for people who want to take their time and feel comfortable. Both choices come with their own benefits as well as drawbacks.
